Dear Co-workers in Christ,

A few years ago I was playing golf with a retired pastor friend of mine and we were preparing to tee off at a hole that had a narrow fairway and lots of ways to get your ball into trouble on either side of the fairway. My friend hit his ball soundly but well off to the right into a dismal bit of woods and undergrowth. I could sense my friend's frustration as he walked back to his bag and shoved his driver back into it's place. "Brian," he said, "That shot almost makes me want to swear. You got any good four letter words for an old preacher who just hit his ball into the rough?" In a moment of inspiration, I said, "Yes, I do – hope."

My friend's golf situation in a way describes the world in miniature. People are looking for something to say, something to do, in the midst of their struggles. The world offers its advice which often reads like this: "Take care of yourself." "You can't win so why try." "It's just your lot in life so you might as well accept it." It is the response Job's wife gave him when she told him to "Curse God, and die." (Job 2:9)

The church has a different response - hope. Hope is the powerful message of the open tomb. It is the message of the blind beggar who is made to see. It is the message of fisherman turned into missionaries, prostitutes into disciples, tax collectors into philanthropists. It is a message of transformation and God's power. This is the word that we speak as Christians to a broken world.

We have the opportunity through our church programs, through our mission projects, and in our daily lives to not only say a word of hope but to be a word of hope. What word will you choose to use in this world?

April Mission Focus

Did You Know?

Greater Indy Habitat for Humanity offers homeownership opportunities to low-income individuals and families who are unable to obtain conventional home financing.

- In Indiana, 1 in 9 households spend half or more of their income on housing.
- In Indiana, the average hourly wage necessary to afford a two-bedroom unit is \$19.00; more than half of Hoosier renters cannot afford the fair market rate.
- Greater Indy Habitat's home construction costs have more than doubled in the past 5 years
 Research shows that Habitat for Humanity's

homeownership program leads to benefits beyond housing:

- Improved quality of life and mental health
- A decreased reliance on social services
- Improved academic achievement of children
- Increased prosperity of families as well as the entire community

In 2022, Greater Indy Habitat launched a strategic plan for growth, setting a historic goal to provide 300 housing solutions to people in the Indianapolis region by the end of 2024. This plan was launched to address the expanding gap in racial inequalities and increasing construction and land costs, among other issues.

Ascent 121 Prayer Journey

The Ascent 121 Prayer Journey is an opportunity for you to drive through the near east side of Indianapolis and pray for areas



affected by trafficking and exploitation. Through this experience you will learn more about the child welfare system, the juvenile justice system, ways that teens are drawn into trafficking, and recovery services that are available to survivors. Guided prayer stops allow you to pray for survivors, teens at risk, educators, social service providers, juvenile justice staff, law enforcement, ministries, and organizations.

Your journey begins in the parking lot at the Indiana Department of Child Services and concludes at the Ascent 121 offices with a debrief for your group to process their experience. A parent must accompany participants under 18.

There is an online orientation sent to you prior to the event. On June 1, meet to receive needed materials for the self-guided drive to multiple locations. Spend as long as you'd like praying for each one. The length of the event depends on how long you spend at each location, but averages between 2- 2-1/2 hours total.


Brightwood Community Center Food Pantry Volunteers







SPRC Staff Spotlight on Joyce Click

For three decades, Joyce Click has been the heart and soul of St. Mark's Children's Music Ministry, guiding young hearts and voices on a journey of faith

and melody. In a recent interview, Joyce graciously shared her reflections on this remarkable journey.

Joyce's musical odyssey began in her youth, when she helped lead music at summer Bible School at her childhood church in Sardinia, Indiana. "We were a musical family," she reminisces, "and we went to church regularly participating in music." This early exposure nurtured a passion that led her to pursue music education at Butler University, laying the foundation for a lifelong commitment to teaching. Retiring after 44 years from Washington Township schools, she currently has positions at both University of Indianapolis and Anderson University, in addition to her St Mark's role.

Throughout her tenure at St Mark's, Joyce's leadership has been marked by countless memorable moments. She recalls one spring musical where a tornado scare prompted the congregation to seek shelter together in the church basement. "Everyone was calm and felt safe," she remembers, "and thankfully no tornadoes touched down that day."

The church's closure at the start of the pandemic meant adapting to class over Zoom. "For over a year, that is how we kept the Kidz Music program going," she shares. "Those 12 or so loyal children who joined me along with Pam Whitehead, our super volunteer, became like family."

What fuels Joyce's passion after all these years? For her, it's the boundless curiosity and kindness of the children she teaches, their enthusiasm serving as a constant source of inspiration. She also enjoys the sense of community at St Mark's, from the families to the pastors and staff, and to the tireless volunteers.

Central to Joyce's approach is the integration of Bible stories and the example that Jesus gave while on earth. "Every single lesson plan for the St. Mark's Children's Music is guided by these teachings," she affirms, ensuring the kids are having fun with music and learning about God's love.

As we celebrate Joyce Click's remarkable 30-year journey at the helm of the Children's Music Ministry, let us extend our deepest gratitude for her unwavering dedication and boundless passion. May her teaching continue to uplift hearts and inspire generations to come!


