Pastor's Place

Dear Co-workers in Christ.

As I study in preparation for this coming Sunday's sermon I have been reading a lot about Sabbath. When I was a kid keeping the Sabbath was generally about things you weren't allowed to do on Sunday. The local grocery store in the small town where I lived until I was eleven closed on Sunday, so if you needed anything for Sunday lunch you had to make sure and buy it on Saturday afternoon. Sunday was a day to relax, reflect, and quietly enjoy. Unfortunately, as a child I didn't want to quietly enjoy – I wanted to do something.

I have always found late July and early August to be a difficult time. It is a time when there is a pause in the programmatic activity in the life of the church. Attendance in worship is often lower than usual. Giving tapers off. People take vacations.

As a pastor, it has always created a certain anxiety. Will all the people who take a few Sundays off for end of the summer activities come back when the Fall begins?

Jesus called his disciples aside for a time of rest. In Mark 6:32 it says that "He [Jesus] said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. (Mark 6:32, NRSV) In America, and around the world, there are entire industries created to accommodate our sense of business, like fast food and call ahead ordering of groceries and household items. We sometimes feel guilty if we are not always occupied in productive activities.

However, the pauses are important. They give us a chance to rest. They give us a chance to restore our health, mentally, spiritually, and physically. It gives us a chance to focus on the divine purpose in our lives.

In his book, "Sabbath: Finding Rest, Renewal, and Delight in Our Busy Lives," author Wayne Muller reminds us, that the Chinese pictograph for "busy" is composed of two characters: heart and killing.

And so, I think about the end of the summer and last-minute trips and holidays and I try to remind myself that this holy pause is important. As we breathe in one last breath of sea air or take in one last beautiful view, we are preparing ourselves to move into what's next with a sense of restful readiness.

So, take some time off. Rest. Relax. Renew. And I will look forward to seeing you in church as we begin our next great adventure.

- And of course, everyone who donated much needed supplies, snacks, and gift cards for VBS itself and for the Perry Township Schools collection.

None of it would have been possible without us coming together in unity as one church family with a common goal: being the hands and feet of Jesus for each camper that came through our doors.

Over 70 million people in the U.S. today are food insecure. We throw away billions of pounds of good food each year. Partnering with faith groups, secular groups, schools, and individuals, the Society of St. Andrew (SoSA) sends willing volunteers to glean fresh fruits and vegetables from fields and orchards. Sharing healthy and nourishing food with hungry people prevents food waste and spreads the abundance that we are provided.

Potatoes cost an average of \$0.89/lb. Last year St. Mark's partnered with SoSA to provided and give away nearly 40,000lbs of potatoes at our annual Potato Drop. Please help us reach our fundraising goal of \$7000 to again host the Potato Drop on September 28.

DeVega faithfully describes the need for reconciliation between humankind and a holy God through Jesus' death on the cross. The Bible uses many images to understand the meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection, and deVega guides us through these images to achieve a richer understanding of the Christian faith. By exploring the mystery of salvation through the cross, we can deepen our love for God and others and strengthen our commitment to follow Jesus.



Stewardship Committee

We sometimes think about stewardship as using our time, talents and treasures wisely when we have extra to share. What about being good stewards when you have little, or when times are tough? I was reminded about the importance of daily stewardship, regardless of your life situation, from a family we were serving several years ago on a mission trip to Red Bird Mission in southeast Kentucky. On this trip, to one of the US's poorest counties, we were made much needed repairs on the home of an elderly couple. One morning, after cleaning off an area on their porch with an old tattered piece of cloth, the wife reminded us not to toss out the old rag we had used. She told us that her mother had taught her not to waste what little she had. On that porch was an old vase holding a collection of wilted flowers. As we cleaned up and prepared to toss those flowers into the trash, she stopped us and said she wanted to take the seeds from those flowers and plant them on the hillside in front of their house so that she could enjoy them in the spring. These are two small examples that show what it means to be good stewards of what we have. Whether you are living in the Carmel or in Appalachia, we can all recognize what God has provided and be good stewards of it.

Trustees Committee

The internal and external sign project is nearing completion. The final revisions are being made and production and installation will soon follow. Thanks to everyone for their input and to the signage subcommittee members for moving this project forward. On a related note, the trustees are pursuing replacement of the monument signs, as the integrity of the signs has deteriorated over time. In addition, the signs will be updated with current information.
