


Pastor's Place

Dear Co-workers in Christ,

One of my favorite activities in life is Christmas caroling. When I was in college I would organize a group of fellow students and we would serenade the music faculty homes during the Christmas season. By the time I was a senior this caroling tradition had taken hold and many of our faculty friends would have food waiting for us. It took us much longer to make the circuit then but by the end of the evening we were well fed! I remember arriving at the choral director's home and having him say, "White, how did all these voice majors convince a horn player to come along with them?" The reality is that it was the other way around – I had recruited my vocal friends to join in. It was actually a pretty fun and musically satisfying group!

I have noticed that many people who normally do not sing and who are really not that interested in music suddenly become enamored with music during the Christmas season. Almost everyone I have ever met can name their favorite Christmas carol or song. When we begin singing Christmas songs in worship I can see people join in who often stand quietly during the congregational singing. The choir cantata Sunday is always a highlight in the celebration of the season.

As we begin to prepare for the birth of our Savior this Advent season we are going to be focusing on the song of God's redemption which entered our world on that first Christmas morning. We will be talking about the ways that our songs of sadness are transformed into songs of joy. We will be remembering the song of Mary as she wrestled with God's plan for her life. We will rejoice with the angels as they announced the birth of the Christ-child. In all these ways we will be asking God to turn up the volume on God's song in our hearts and in our lives!

One of the books that impacted my early life of faith was "The Singer" by Calvin Miller. In this poetic retelling of the Gospel story Miller says, "I knew a blind man whom a surgeon helped to see. The doctor never had a lover such as he. It is in such a way that singers love composers."

As we try to sing the song of God's redemption it is a way to fall in love with the composer of our universe and our salvation. Let's sing the songs of Christmas this year not as meaningless repetitions but as love songs to a God who loves us and wants the best for us!

Did you Know?

- Mission Guatemala is a United Methodist related organization with a mission to help meet the basic needs and improve the quality of life of underserved Guatemalan people through health, education, and nutrition initiatives and meaningful missionary service.
- Mission Guatemala Inc. was founded in early 2009 by Tom Heaton, a United Methodist pastor. In the spring of 2010, Mission Guatemala located a mission site in the community of San Andrés Semetebaj.
- Guatemala has one of the highest rates in the
 world for chronic childhood malnutrition. Mission
 Guatemala's nutritional initiatives have included
 full-time school nutrition programs, and weekly
 lunches served in several community public
 elementary schools. Additional projects continue: a
 medical clinic and pharmacy, dental clinic, eye
 clinic, feeding centers for chronically malnourished
 children, community development projects,
 vocational training programs, water filters for
 schools and families, and fuel-efficient woodburning stoves.






Does your faith make room for questions? Everyone has doubts. Where is God when bad things happen? Does God hear our prayers? Is there a heaven?



How can we know? We might treat such questions as the enemy of faith, but uncertainty doesn't mean our belief is lacking. Doubt can be a path to a deeper, richer encounter with God. In this book, pastor and best-selling author Adam Hamilton explores key questions of doubt with honesty and insight, drawing on the rich wisdom of the Bible, Christian tradition, and his experience walking with thousands of people on their spiritual journey. Whether you're a longtime Christian or someone brand new to faith, this book will lead you to a trust in God that is unafraid of hard questions. Wrestle with doubt and find faith—belief and trust, not certainty; mystery rather than simple answers.

preparing the way for God, the impact and significance of prayer, the substance of good works and caring for others, and sharing God's mission to the world.


Books are \$9, available at St. Mark's (connection tables and door #2) for group or individual study. Some groups have already begun, so join in at your convenience for the chapters you need:

QPR Suicide Prevention Training

Do you struggle with how to respond to a friend, colleague. or loved one who feels depressed, hopeless or overwhelmed and could be considering suicide? Save the date for our upcoming QPR training.

QPR is an evidence-based program teaching how to recognize and respond to warning signs, clues and communications of suicidal people and how to get help for the person who has suicidal thoughts. It is not a form of counseling, but rather a way to act vigorously - to Question, Persuade, and Refer to prevent a possible tragedy. QPR is for adults of all ages, regardless of life stage. Dream Day & Breakthrough Prayer



Dream Day was a congregation-wide event on September 15 with guided brainstorming sessions to gather ideas for the future of St. Mark's. This was a continuation of our spirit of openness for God to reveal new hopes and dreams for St. Mark's through the last 18 months of the breakthrough prayer initiative.

The attendees consisted of 60 people (6 kids and youth, 17 in 40-60s age group, and the remainder age 60+) with many long-time

members and 11 people new to St. Mark's within the last 5 years. The 2-hour event included two brainstorming sessions in groups of 8-11 people and a closing event with each person putting a favorite idea on the rolling bulletin board (see photo).

Participants were given 17 brainstorming questions and a few minutes to record their answers. Topics looked both inside and outside the walls of St. Mark's — the ways we welcome, grow, and serve; new ideas for God's call for our church; areas needing improvement or activities that are no longer needed. Scribes in each group recorded answers that were discussed verbally, and all participants were invited to turn in their individual notes on every question.

What are some of the hopes and dreams that people brought forward for St. Mark's? Our Dream Day task force is still compiling the results from individual responses, but here are some highlights from the group-level notes from scribes.

Big-Picture Themes

- Desire for intergenerational gathering opportunities
- · Wanting to get youth involved in worship services regularly
- Providing opportunities to engage with the community (e.g., having outside speakers and/or fun gatherings)

Most Popular Topics related to:

- Specific ideas for partnerships with existing community organizations
- New outreach and service opportunities, including options for busy families
- Ideas for connecting in our own community and for reaching disconnected people, including ideas for the 10AM Education & Small Groups hour on Sundays
- Stewardship of time and finances, including more transparency
- Ideas for different ways to use or improve our church's physical spaces
- Ideas for spiritual growth and congregational care




