Worship Time Restructure

After prayerful assessment of the evolving needs of our worshiping community, the Worship Committee, with the approval of the Church Council, is excited to announce a shift in our Sunday worship programming. On August 25, 2024, our Sunday worship schedule will transition to have the 8:15am Traditional service, a 9:30am Traditional service, and The Current at 11:00am.

Rationale

Moving The Current and one of our traditional services would allow us to take advantage of the following opportunities:

 Many church growth studies show that younger families are more likely to attend a later service. Additionally, this demographic is more often drawn to a modern/contemporary style of worship. This is validated with anecdotal evidence in our congregation.



- Research shows that churches are aging as young people disengage, but strategic churches can "grow young."* We believe this strategic switch may allow us to attract more young people to worship.
- Switching the services would allow musicians in the traditional services, such as members of the handbells, chancel choir, and orchestra, to play and/or sing in backto-back services rather than having a 90-minute gap between their services.
- Making this time change would eliminate one setup change of the chancel area between services. The first two traditional services (at 8:15 and 9:30) could be a little closer together in time because there would be no setup change between them. This allows more time between the traditional services and The Current and eliminates the need to switch back to the traditional setup after The Current finishes. It also allows The Current more time if it runs long.

Considerations and Logistics

We realize that this will create some logistical questions, exciting new opportunities, and new flexibility for Sunday programming.



We will be in conversations over the next few months to develop implementation plans for all our Sunday Morning ministries. It is our plan to provide forums open to the entire congregation to provide feedback and suggestions as we move forward.

As St. Mark's approaches this next season of development, we are encouraged by the new energy of our ever-dynamic church. St. Mark's congregation is courageously committed to the needs of our community while remaining steadfast to our foundational vision to welcome, grow, and serve.

Pastor's Place

Dear Co-workers in Christ,

What does June mean to you? For many people June means graduation and moving into what's next in education or a first full-time job.

Oftentimes, June means weddings as college sweethearts begin their next phase in life together. For pastors and church staff it often means a pause in some of the school year programming and a brief moment of rest before Vacation Bible School and summertime events.

But for those of us who are United Methodist Pastors June means Annual Conference! Annual Conference is part business meeting, part convention, and part family reunion for clergy families and long-time lay members. It is a time to make decisions, to renew old friendships, and to welcome new friends and colleagues.

Annual Conference has an added dimension when it is immediately after a General Conference, the United Methodist Church's denomination-wide meeting, which normally happens every four years. Such is the case for Indiana United Methodists in 2024.

I first attended the South Indiana Annual Conference in 1982 so this will be my 43rd time attending, first as an observer, then as a probationary member of the conference, and finally as an Ordained Elder in Full Connection. I have seen lots of change in the past forty plus years. Some years not much has changed and other years we have significant changes – like the year we moved from South and North Indiana Conferences to one Indiana Conference.

This year's General Conference made some important decisions that will impact local churches and annual conferences. We removed exclusive language from the Book of Discipline, which restored the Discipline to it's original 1968 language. The GC also approved a plan to allow the United States to have cultural provisions for the Book of Discipline, something Europe, Africa, and Asia have been allowed to do for quite some time.

We are planning to have question and answer session on June 2 at 3:00 PM in the sanctuary at St. Mark's for those that may have questions about the General Conference decisions. In the meantime, you can download a helpful summary at https://inumc.org/generalconference or stop by the church office for a printed copy.

God continues to work in powerful ways through the United Methodist Church and we look forward to being a part of the movement of God's Spirit here at St. Mark's, in Indiana, and throughout the world!

Did You Know?

Lucille Raines Residence (LRR) is a facility owned and operated by the United Women in Faith of Indiana (UWF).

LRR, located in downtown Indianapolis, was founded in 1977.

LRR houses up to 49 individuals recovering from alcohol and drug addiction, giving people a place to rebuild their lives and relationships with God, all while learning how to function independently day-to-day and working on successful recovery. LRR is in GREAT financial need due to UWF units disbanding locally and aging members.

The operating budget at LRR requires \$8,500.00 per month from United Women in Faith of Indiana to maintain this ministry. There has been a deficit of several thousand dollars for a number of months, putting this crucial ministry at risk.

Trinity Haven's goal is to help young people graduate from these programs into safe and stable permanent housing with improved life skills, a bigger social network, and the ability to thrive. 
