Pastor's Place

Dear Co-workers in Christ,

What is our purpose in life? In recent years, this has been a frequent topic in conversations and in Christian books. I personally have read several of the "purpose driven life" books. At many levels, I have found Rick Warren and others helpful in discovering a course and purpose for my life. However, I am often left with the uneasy feeling that life is more complicated than anyone's formula for finding meaning and purpose.

One of the giants in Methodism in the twentieth century was a British clergyman named Lesley Weatherhead. Weatherhead tells this story:

I remember so clearly going out "birding" in Yorkshire with a dear friend of mine. We watched some jackdaws apparently building a nest in the crevices of an old ruined tower. They gathered their material and they pushed it into the crevices. Apparently, they could not realize that it was dropping right through the crevices on to the floor inside the hollow tower. If they can feel frustrated, they must have felt terribly frustrated about that. Believe me or not, when we walked into the tower, there was a heap of nesting material almost up to my shoulders. But when we went to a farmhouse adjoining the ruins, an old lady, crippled with arthritis, came out and talked to us, and she said this, "You know the jackdaws are doing me a wonderful service. They gather my kindling for me. I use what they push through the holes at the top of that ruined tower to start my fire." (Leslie D. Weatherhead, The Key Next Door, 17-18)

Sometimes I think the purpose we might identify for ourselves and the greater purpose in God's economy might be very different. Like the birds in Weatherhead's story, we may serve a higher purpose even if that purpose sometimes eludes our understanding.

The important thing is that we always strive to discover God's direction in our life and that we set about to do what God calls us to do. We can't wait until we understand every nuance of God's purpose for our lives to become active. There are times when serving God means putting one foot in front of the other and trusting God for the destination.

When it comes to serving God we have to ask - "What are we waiting for?"

Did You Know?

The Brightwood Community Center, a nonprofit organization, has been compassionately dedicated to building stronger families and vibrant communities for 89 years. Despite the chaos in the economy and the world at-large, the Brightwood Community Center continues to be a hub for the Brightwood community, delivering excellent programming while also giving hope to families around Indianapolis. Their goals are to cultivate and expand opportunities, skills, resources, and connections to enrich lives.

Programs include:

- Healing Circles, where community members can find support in addressing trauma in the community
- Youth Summer Camp, designed to increase reading, experiential learning, comprehension skills, build character and teamwork
- Workforce Development
- Pro Se Legal Assistance programs
- "Client Choice" food pantry twice a month, where clients can select foods that best meet their needs and all individuals are eligible. St. Mark's volunteers help with stocking and assisting clients with shopping, on most Tuesdays & Wednesdays.

May In-Kind Donations



Have you ever had to spend a night without a bed? Family Promise of Greater Indianapolis shelters families who previously had to sleep in cars, park pavilions, even abandoned houses. You can help Family Promise

expand its homeless shelter to allow more children and parents from having to sleep without a bed! #NightWithoutABed is the primary fundraising campaign to support Family Promise's Apartment Shelter Program, allowing Family Promise to sustain 24 apartment shelters in the coming year, making it the largest family shelter in Indianapolis. The cost for one 12-month lease on an apartment, plus security deposit, utilities, Internet, insurance, and some repairs is about \$15,000. The shelter program has a housing rate of 77%! Ascent 121 Prayer Journey

The Ascent 121 Prayer Journey is an opportunity for you to drive through the near east side of Indianapolis and pray for areas affected by trafficking and exploitation. Through this experience you will learn more about the child welfare system, the juvenile justice system, ways that teens are drawn into trafficking, and recovery services that are available to survivors. Guided prayer stops allow you to pray for survivors, teens at risk, educators, social service providers, juvenile justice staff, law enforcement, ministries, and organizations.

Your journey begins in the parking lot at the Indiana Department of Child Services and concludes at the Ascent 121 offices with a debrief for your group to process their experience. A parent must accompany participants under 18.

There is an online orientation sent to you prior to the event. On June 1, meet to receive needed materials for the self-guided drive to multiple locations. Spend as long as you'd like praying for each one. The length of the event depends on how long you spend at each location, but averages between 2- 2-1/2 hours total.

Stewardship - All In

What do these words bring to mind? Yes, we're all in to play pickleball or basketball, and we are all supportive of a new project for St.

Mark's. But in our world today this phrase is a modern-day term with many interpretations but generally, we take it as yes, we are all in agreement, we are "All In."

In Biblical times do you think the Disciples were "All In" when asked by Jesus to stop what they were doing and follow him? In Hebrew the word "all" is taken as "kol" and can mean "all of, each or entire (of us.)" But there is no word for "in." It is a prefix. The closest you will come in The Bible to All In is "all in all" in Corinthians as God being all in all.

Trustees

Work continues on the kitchen project. The electrical portion of the project is now complete. We are hopeful that the stove will be delivered and wired in place, by the middle of May. Your patience is greatly appreciated, as this project progresses.

The Church parking lot maintenance is tentatively scheduled for the first week of June.

The parking lot cracks will be repaired and the entire parking area will be resealed and striped. Accordingly, the parking lot will have limited access during this period. Weather permitting, it is anticipated that this will take four days to complete. In order to complete this project, vehicles should be out of the lot adjacent to the Gray Road entrance by Sunday evening. Likewise, all vehicles should be out of the lot adjacent to 126 Street by Monday. The striping portion of the project will begin Wednesday or Thursday night and no vehicles should be left in the lot, overnight, as the work will be done overnight. These dates are obviously dependent upon weather conditions and subject to change. Your cooperation and understanding during this temporary period of inconvenience is appreciated.


Financial Update

As a Finance Committee we want to thank you for your generosity in supporting the work that we do in the name of Jesus Christ! Through your prayers, your service and your gifts, you have helped St. Mark's as we strive to live out our motto: Where Mission is a Way of Life. So, first of all, THANKS!

We also need to let you know about a concern we see on the horizon. So far, our giving in 2024 has been strong and we are thankful for that. However, if our historic giving pattern holds true, we anticipate a significant shortfall as we enter into late summer. We need your increased financial support during the summer to make ensure that St. Mark's continues to be a welcoming and missional church.

Our 2024 estimated operating expenses are \$1,156,057, which is approximately a 4% decrease compared to 2023. We are grateful to the staff for their careful financial management that has resulted in several years of decreased expenses despite 29% economic inflation over that period. In fact, over the past 10 years, we have maintained largely the same level of expenses, not even adjusting for inflation. This year, we are in the unique position of having to close the gap between our church pledges and our expected expenses for the year.

After careful consideration and budgeting, we remain a little over \$96,000 from our goal, which equates to an approximate \$8,000 per month shortfall over the course of the year. At our current rate of giving, we will have to make severe cuts in programming and mission giving in order to have a balanced budget at year's end. Rather than cutting activities that are vital to the well-being of our church we are asking you, our St. Mark's members, to consider helping us meet our goal.



How can you help? First, we ask you to pray for us, that we be led to making the right decisions for St. Mark's. Next, please consider whether you can increase your support of St. Mark's financially, either by increasing your pledge by a small percentage or making a one-time gift.

We regularly experience substantially lower giving during the summer months. We anticipate that this will cause a financial shortfall July-September. To reduce the impact of this pattern, we would ask that you consider giving through regular monthly electric funds transfer (ACH). This is an easy option selecting ACH on the website Giving page or you can contact the church office. This small step can help to maintain consistent cash flow throughout the year, ensuring funds are available for our ministry efforts throughout the year.

Thank you again for your continued love and support of St. Mark's. Together, let's go change the world!
