

Dear Co-workers in Christ:

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased!" (Luke 2:14)

One of the things that I enjoy most about the Christmas season is the singing. It all started with a group of angels singing God's message to an unsuspecting group of shepherds. Each year many of us look forward to the opportunity to sing our favorite Christmas songs once again.



The words to one of my favorite Christmas songs were written by Henry W. Longfellow. In the third stanza of "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day" Longfellow writes:

And in despair I bowed my head:

"There is no peace on earth," I said,

"For hate is strong, and mocks the song

Of peace on earth, good-will to men."

As we examine our world this year it is easy to see ways in which hatred reigns. There are still countries at war with each other. People are still dying from hunger not because there isn't enough food in the world to feed all of us but because we can't seem to get it to the right place at the right time. It is still frightening to walk at night in almost any city.

Luckily, neither the Gospel story nor Longfellow's poem ends here. Longfellow continues:

Then pealed the bells more loud and deep:

"God is not dead, nor doth He sleep;

The wrong shall fail, the right prevail,

With peace on earth, good-will to men:

Christmas is a time to remember that God sent Christ to bring peace. It is a reminder that even when things seem out of hand God will ultimately prevail. It is a reminder that we are participants in the greatest struggle and the greatest celebration in all humankind. This Christmas season let us continue to sing the Angel's song: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men . . ."

#### **Did You Know?**

- In Indiana, the average hourly wage necessary to afford a two-bedroom unit is \$19.00;
   more than half of Hoosier renters cannot afford the fair market rate.
- Greater Indy Habitat for Humanity offers homeownership opportunities to low-income individuals and families who are unable to obtain conventional home financing.
- Research shows that Habitat for Humanity's homeownership program leads to benefits beyond housing, including improved mental health, a decreased reliance on social services, and improved academic achievement of children.
- In 2022, Greater Indy Habitat launched a strategic plan for growth, setting a historic goal to provide 300 housing solutions to people in the Indianapolis region by the end of 2024. This plan was launched to address the expanding gap in racial inequalities and increasing construction and land costs, among other issues.
- St. Mark's continues to partner with Habitat on build sites and through volunteers who are involved in their mentorship program.

### **Did You Know?**

- Human trafficking of minors occurs in every county in Indiana, in every state in the U.S., and in every country of the world.
- In 2021, human trafficking cases in Indiana involved 176 known victims. Trafficking was categorized into three types: sex, labor, and a combination of both.
- Recruitment can and does occur everywhere—in school, at home, malls, sporting events, and parties; and in shelters and detention facilities—and is conducted both in person and online, where traffickers lure young people with the offer of friendship, romance, or jobs.

### What is Ascent 121?

- Ascent 121 is a non-profit organization committed to helping survivors of commercial sexual exploitation.
- Their mission is to empower young people and their families through long-term recovery services to position them for their next chapter in life.
- Built on a foundation of faith, Ascent 121 provides a continuum of care for survivors of human trafficking.




