"Take a walk through the Bethlehem of 2000 years ago and experience the sights and sounds leading up to the birth of the Messiah, Jesus Christ." Holy Walk was this year! December 1 st and 2nd

What is Holy Walk? Holy Walk is a community outreach that has become a tradition for many families in our community. These families look forward to the Holy Walk every two years. A little history: Cindi and Chris Miller attended a Holy Walk in Atlanta; Janet and Doug Brown attended a Holy Walk in Michigan. The

four of them got together and started planning a walk for St. Mark's in 1999. They met regularly for a year to plan the event, combining ideas from both previously attended events. The first year, 1600 guests attended and 3,000 the second year!

It transports you back to the time of the Holy Child's birth. A guide leads you through the village where you meet characters from that time. Roman guards meet you at the entrance. When you approach the tax collectors, you must have your papers stamped before you can enter the village. Once there, you'll meet shepherds, live animals, prophets, Wise Men, angels and finally the Christ Child! After your journey, you retire to the gym for hot cocoa and cookies. Comments include: "Was the authenticity of the entire experience. I love the village." Winning games, learning about Jesus and kindness of St. Mark's." I felt like I was transported to Bethlehem. Very meaningful and an amazing experience. I hope that you were able to take the opportunity to travel through Bethlehem to meet the Christ Child.

Daily Prayer Guide 2023 Reflecting on God's Faithfulness

In the well-loved hymn "Great Is Thy Faithfulness," Thomas Chisholm celebrates God's absolute steadfastness. Just as we cannot earn God's favor by our actions, we cannot escape God's love and compassion.

The Bible powerfully declares that life's joys and pleasures reflect God's gifts and goodness, while life's pain and disappointments are tempered and transformed by God's constant presence. New mercies appear morning by morning as expressions of God's unchanging allegiance. God never stops calling us in gentle and sometimes fierce ways not loving relationships with God and our neighbors.

A sense of God's total faithfulness guides our individual and collective commitment to minister to and change a hurting world—to extend mercy and justice, achieve peace, care for the needy, and comfort the brokenhearted.

This year's Daily Prayer Guide offers glimpses of God's faithfulness through the reflections and prayers of missionaries, deaconesses/home missioners, staff of National Mission Institutions, retirees and others, and also through the art of children. The witnesses of the biblical text and the sharing of these witnesses may connect with your own story. When have you experienced God's faithfulness in times of doubt? Of joy? Or celebrated God's faithfulness in your life and calling? Do you have practices that help you remember God's faithfulness in the midst of disasters and injustices, or when God seems far away? Or close at hand? Is there someone who would be blessed by glimpses of God's faithfulness in your story? In your journey with Jesus Christ?

The hymn writer points to nature and the seasons, seedtime and harvest, as signs of God's faithfulness. Are we also signs of God's faithfulness? When we are confident of God's faithfulness, we are strengthened to live out our own callings to service, to giving, to witness, and to advocacy for equity and just systems that honor the image of God in every person.

In God's faithfulness we find "strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow."

This is the recipe from MaryEtta Yoho's daughter, Rachel Blacker.

Crescent Roll Veggie Pizza

Prep Time: 15 minutes Cook Time: 15 minutes Total Time: 30 minutes

Servings: 12 slices

Ingredients

2 tubes of refrigerator crescent rolls
1- 8 oz pkg of cream cheese – softened at room temperature
1/3 cup sour cream
1 envelope of dry ranch salad dressing mix

2 TBSP of dill weed or 1/4 cup of fresh dill – chopped small

1 small head of broccoli – cut
1 red bell pepper – diced small
2 English cucumber – diced small
3/4 cup match stick or shredded carrots
1 yellow bell pepper – diced small

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 350° as directed on the crescent roll package instructions.

Dice all of the vegetables.

Spread crescent rolls across the cookie sheet so that cover the entire cookie sheet.

Using your fingers pinch the perforations on the crescent rolls to seal them together.

Bake according to crescent roll package instructions.

Cool completely before adding toppings (you can also cool it and lightly cover it with a paper towel or plastic wrap and leave on the countertop overnight).

In a medium-sized bowl, add softened cream cheese, sour cream, ranch dip, and dill; stir until fully mixed.

To assemble the pizza:

Spread the ranch dill dip all over the baked and cooled crescent roll pizza base.

Add chopped mixed veggies in this order, broccoli, cucumber, yellow bell peppers, red bell peppers, carrots. Cut into equal squares and serve.
